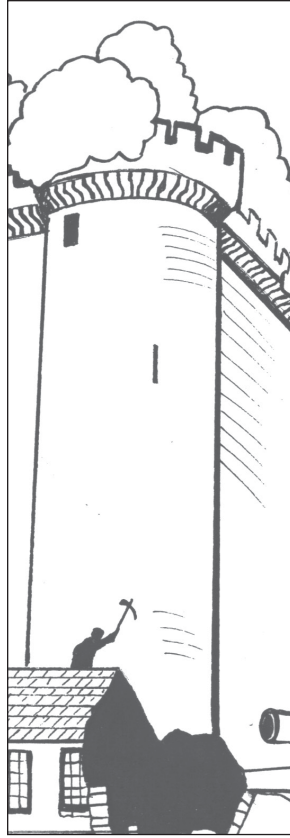

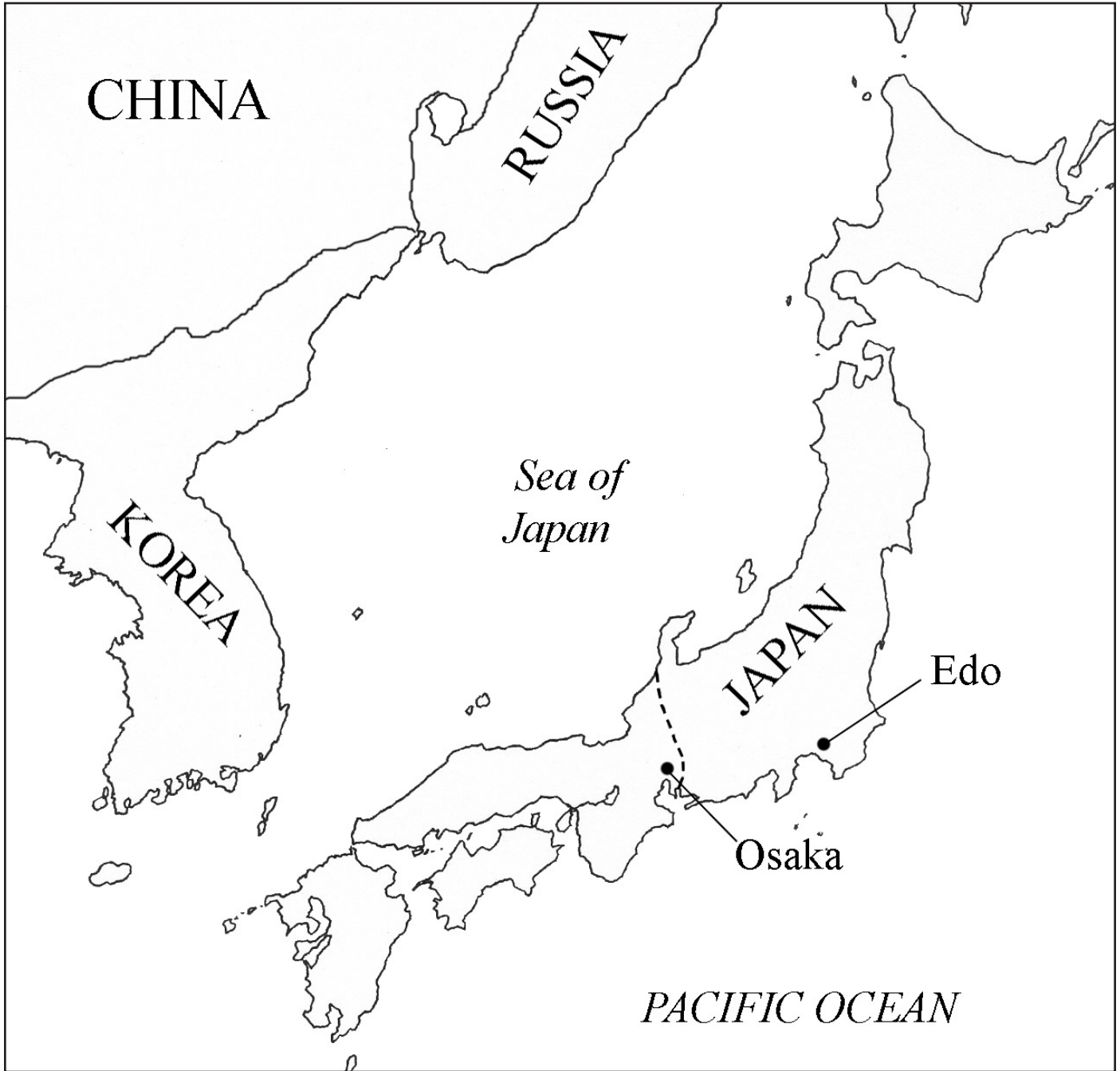

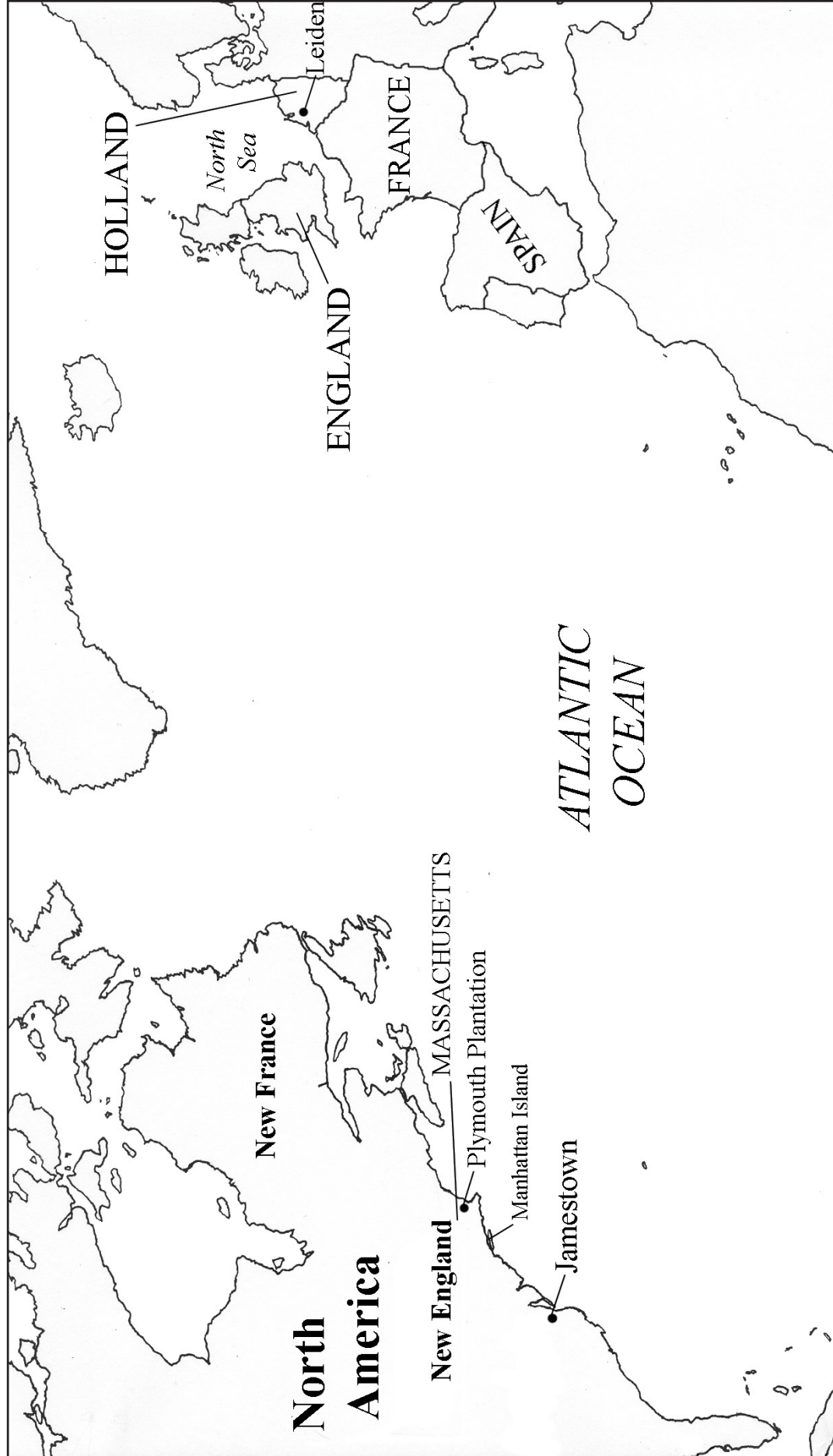

The Manhattan Letter

High Mighty Sirs:

Here arrived yesterday the ship The Arms of Amsterdam, which sailed from New Netherland out of the Mauritius River on September 23; they reported that our people there are of good courage, and live peaceably. Their women, also, have borne children there, they have bought the island Manhattes from the wild men for the value of sixty guilders, is 11,000 morgens in extent.
